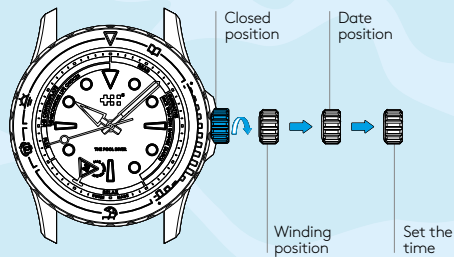

Setting the time

Unscrew the crown* anti-clockwise from the case to position 1 for winding in power. Wind in a clockwise direction to re-power the watch.

To set the date pull gently into position 2 and turn in a clockwise direction.

Pull gently into position 3. This position is used for handseting and stopping of the seconds hand. For precise time setting it is recommended to pass beyond the desired minute and to set the hand backwards



*The screw-down crown should sit flush to the case in order to maintain water resistance.



Holidaying with your watch

The bezel is a vital part of the diving watch experience.

Using the bezel with the dial instructions doesn't just categorise your ~~ice cream timetable~~ busy day by the pool, but helps you unwind, decompress and plot your revenge on your enemies, all from the comfort of your sunbed.

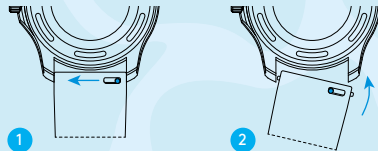


Changing your strap

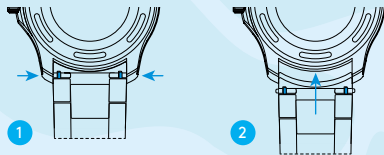
- 1 Locate the quick-release pins on your strap or bracelet. Pinch the pins inwards to detach.
- 2 To reattach your strap or bracelet, pinch the pins inwards, and align the spring bars so they click securely into the lug holes on each side.



Detaching and reattaching a strap



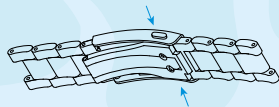
Detaching and reattaching a bracelet



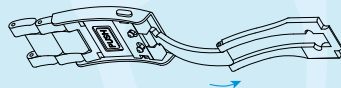


Using the micro adjustment on your bracelet

- 1 Press buttons to release.
- 2 Pull open the clasp.
- 3 There are five micro adjustment positions, which allows for a maximum extension of 6mm. To extend, push the button to unlock and simultaneously pull on the bracelet into the desired position.
- 4 To shorten, simply push the button and then slide the bracelet back into the clasp.

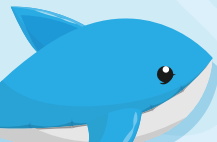
